Ribbon cut for new infrastructure at Commerce Park

Owners of the Commerce Park of Branson and the Park View Terrace Residential Community held a ribbon cutting ceremony Wednesday to dedicate several miles of new streets, sewer and water lines to the city of Branson.

Branson Mayor Raeanne Presley along with several city officials were on hand for the brief ceremony, and then Phil Lopez, developer of Commerce Park and Tom Boyce, the general contractor for the project, took officials on a tour of the new streets.

According to City Engineer David Miller, there are about six miles of new roads in the development, and they, along with water and sewer lines, have been built to city standards.

Mayor Presley complimented the developers on the project that she said will bring year-round, good paying jobs to the Branson area and wished them continued success in completing and occupying the Commerce Park. The Commerce Park is located at the southwest corner of Missouri Highway 248 and Buena Vista Road in north Branson.

The Commerce Park is designed for local, national and international customers who need high-speed communication, abundant electrical service and coming next fall, natural gas.

Park View Terrace next to Commerce Park will feature 200 single family homes and about 500 apartments and condominiums for employees of the Park as well as others working in Branson area businesses.
